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OUR CURRENT WORK

POLICY

- <u>NJ Integrated Care for Kids (NJ InCK)</u>: NJ InCK is a model of pediatric care that emphasizes community-based case management and screening for children and families who are at the highest risk for health complexity. We colead this CMMI model with <u>Hackensack Meridian</u> <u>Health</u> and <u>Visiting Nurse Association Health</u> <u>Group</u>.
- Maternity: We are actively working to improve the safety and quality of maternal health in New Jersey. Current work includes advancing Nurture NI's strategic plan through our Maternity Action Plan (MAP) which focuses on data collection, supporting the workforce, reforming payment, and improving social supports. Our policy team works to promote the long-term sustainability of innovative models like HealthySteps, <u>CenteringPregnancy and CenteringParenting</u>, including understanding current payment structure and building a payment strategy that would allow for program growth across the state. Our maternity work is supported by The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, The Burke Foundation, and NJAAP.
- Findings and Recommendations to Support Advanced Primary Care: We were engaged by the New Jersey Department of Human

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Services to conduct a market scan of primary care, including alternative payment models ("APM") currently in use in New Jersey. The work included convening a workgroup of stakeholders and subject matter experts to inform the market scan and develop recommendations to support Advanced Primary Care in New Jersey.

 Essential Jobs Essential Care Coalition – Building upon the work of our <u>Guidance</u> <u>Document to Recruit, Train, and Retain a Resilient</u> <u>and Diverse Health Care Workforce for New</u> <u>Jersey</u>, the Quality Institute has joined the Essential Jobs Essential Care (EJEC) Coalition to improve the recruitment, training, and retention of direct care workers, such as home health aides and certified nursing assistants, in New Jersey. This work is supported by <u>The</u> <u>Taub Foundation</u>.

QUALITY

 <u>TeamBirth NJ</u>: The Quality Institute with <u>Ariadne Labs</u> launched a shared decisionmaking initiative, <u>TeamBirth</u>, in New Jersey. TeamBirth works to improve maternal and infant outcomes and inequities that are the result of breakdowns in teamwork and communication in the delivery system. This work is supported by New Jersey Department of Health.

- <u>Raising the Bar</u> (RTB) for Maternal Health in New Jersey: RTB is a framework for health care systems to improve care for all birthing people and babies that defines four roles that they play as providers of care, employers, community partners, and advocates. The Quality Institute is currently working with two hospitals in New Jersey to apply RTB strategies. This work is supported by the <u>Robert Wood</u> Johnson Foundation.
- <u>The Leapfrog Group</u>: The Quality Institute is the Regional Leader for The Leapfrog Group in New Jersey and New York. We provide support to hospitals and Ambulatory Surgical Centers (ASC) to achieve the highest participation rate in the country in <u>The Leapfrog Group's annual Hospital and ASC Survey</u>.
- <u>Quality Briefings</u>: The Quality Institute releases regular Quality Briefings to advance quality improvement work. Recent briefings have focused on screening and testing and hand hygiene best practices.

COMMUNITY HEALTH

- <u>Mayors Wellness Campaign (MWC)</u>: MWC is a statewide community health initiative which provides communities with technical assistance for collecting local data, and prioritizing health-related needs, planning and implementing programs to address those needs, and developing evaluations. Over 430 communities across New Jersey are participating.
- <u>Conversation of Your Life (COYL)</u>: COYL is a statewide community-based program focused on the value and steps for Advance Directives. COYL is a part of the MWC.
- **Mental Health Focus:** With support from <u>The Horizon Foundation for New Jersey</u>, we are running programs with MWCs to combat stigma around mental health and to train people in <u>Mental Health First Aid</u>. With support from the <u>HealthCare Foundation of New Jersey</u> we are training doulas, community health workers, and others who support pregnant individuals, in Mental Health First Aid.
