We know that the <u>first three years</u> of a child's life form the foundation for their longterm health, well-being, and advancement. We also know how important it is for children to regularly see a pediatrician during this critical period when they are changing so rapidly. The traditional pediatric office visit, although a key element of creating a healthy environment for children, is not sufficient on its own for many children because so many aspects of a child's environment cannot be addressed in this setting. These include whether the family has enough nutritious food to eat, has car seats or cribs, or needs guidance in dealing with a child's tantrums or sleep difficulties. A traditional pediatric practice cannot do it alone.

At the Quality Institute, I lead our work on alternative and integrated models of pediatric care. One such model is <u>HealthySteps</u>, a national program recently introduced in five New Jersey pediatric practices...

Interview Sneak Peek: Axia recently opened Axia Access Now, a first-of-its-kind clinic in Sewell, New Jersey, that offers a full range of women's health services with walk-in and same-day appointments available. How has the new concept been received so far?

We've received great feedback from the community so far. We're proud to have a Net Promoter Score of 78, which is above the health care industry average. In the last year, we've helped about 9,000 women access critical women's health services, ranging from annual visits to contraceptive counseling, STI testing, and pregnancy testing. We also offer ultrasounds and mammograms, as well as walk-in care for issues such as abnormal bleeding or menstrual problems. We are accommodating very busy women who may not be able to access care elsewhere...
