Our Maternity Action Plan gathering last week brought together more than 120 people, all committed to making New Jersey the safest, most equitable place to give birth and raise a child. The range of attendees enabled doulas to converse with state health officials; midwives to chat with a medical school dean; community health workers to engage with program officers at philanthropies.

<u>Interview Sneak Peek:</u> Is there a program or priority that you are most excited about sharing with our readers that Wellpoint (formerly Amerigroup in New Jersey) is focused on right now?

We are working closely with our state partners in the Murphy Administration to implement a series of innovative NJ FamilyCare program changes to integrate care and address health related social needs. We are proceeding with the federal government's approval under what is known as a Medicaid waiver program.

The New Jersey Department of Human Services remains on the cutting edge — and we're particularly excited about the housing supports the Medicaid waiver program will provide for Medicaid recipients, such as pre-tenancy services, tenancy sustaining services, home modifications or remediation services, and move-in support services. It's about keeping people in their homes and ensuring that their homes are habitable, safe places for them and their families...

Engage in Our Mental Health First Aid Offerings



If your organization provides services to pregnant people in Essex, Morris, or Union County, your employees may be eligible to receive free **Perinatal Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) training.** The training is designed for Community Health Workers, doulas, nurses, and others who support pregnant people. *The Quality Institute is thankful to the Healthcare Foundation of New Jersey* for its generous support of this work.

We are also convening a small workgroup to develop an additional maternity-specific case study for use in Perinatal MHFA nationally.
