We recently held our annual Quality Improvement convening to recognize quality and safety professionals from every hospital in the state. While patient safety is a collective effort, these individuals were named by their organizations and recognized by the Quality Institute for their ongoing dedication to safety and quality. We honored their commitment to their patients, colleagues, and communities. # Interviews with members, influencers, and noteworthy people

Forge Health is a member the Quality Institute's Provider council.

<u>Interview Sneak Peek:</u> How has your personal background and family history with veterans informed Forge Health's focus?

At Forge Health, we provide goal-oriented treatment proven effective in helping people overcome mental health challenges, substance use, and associated trauma. My brother Jon served in the U.S. Army as an infantry officer deployed to two war zones, including Iraq. And the devastating statistic is that my brother lost more of his soldiers to suicide than in combat. He also lost soldiers to alcohol-related driving accidents.

That experience showed me what happens when mental health treatment is not effective, affordable, or accessible. I saw the need for providers who can treat high-acuity patients on an outpatient basis. Treatment needs to be in-network with commercial health insurance companies, as well as Medicaid and Medicare. And you need to have qualified and trained professionals providing care. That's why we founded Forge Health in 2016.

## WHAT WE'RE READING

In <u>an op-ed</u> published in USA Today, Dr. Michal Herman, a dentist who cares for young children, and is COO of the KinderSmile Foundation, shared how New Jersey "is well behind other states in providing access to dental care, particularly for those in marginalized communities. The first Basic Screening Survey by the New Jersey Department of Health found that children in Head Start have untreated dental decay at twice the rate of the national average. We are failing our kids." She explained that,

"When we don't have enough dentists willing to accept Medicaid, the program fails. The driving problem is the Medicaid rates. New Jersey Medicaid fee-for-service rates have been frozen for nearly 20 years. Furthermore, the MCOs pay even less than the fee-for-service rates."
