<u>Op-Ed: Time for transparency in crisis pregnancy centers in New Jersey</u>, *Hudson County View*: In this op-ed, Assemblywoman Jessica Ramirez (D-32) addresses crisis pregnancy centers (CPCs) and the introduction of a bill she sponsored, <u>A5418</u>, aimed at establishing consumer protections. This legislation mandates that CPCs display clear signage in both English and Spanish in their waiting and examination rooms.

Why Medicaid cuts put adult dental care on the chopping block, Axios: Maya Goldman discusses the potential effects of Congress cutting Medicaid funding to states to extend tax cuts, particularly on adult dental care. As budgets shrink, legislators may prioritize other areas, leading uninsured individuals to seek treatment in hospitals. Melissa Burroughs from the CareQuest Institute for Oral Health warns, "Without coverage, many will delay care or turn to emergency rooms, increasing health care costs and worsening outcomes."
